Session II JULY 9 - AUGUST 7, 2010

### Maya Culture and Archaeology of Belize

This course provides a survey of the Maya peoples and history of Belize, through archeology, linguistics, and cultural history from pre-history to the present day. Students will be introduced to Maya architecture, art, language, and culture-- experientially and through lectures and classes. Field trips and archaeological digging are also a large portion of the class.



### Mesoamerican Civilization

This course will survey the prehistory of ancient Mesoamerica, with particular focus on the major aboriginal cultures of Mexico, Guatemala, and Belize (i.e. the Olmecs, Teotihuacan, Zapotecs, Maya, Aztecs, etc.). Lectures, readings, slides, films, field trips, and discussions will cover the Pre-Columbian archaeology and culture history of Mesoamerica, with specific attention to the native arts, architecture, scientific achievements, physical anthropology and paleo-ethnography of principal native groups. The course progresses chronologically from Paleo-Indian times to the European Conquest, with emphasis on major cultural achievements and the growth of civilizations in the various regions of the area.

### **Program Fees and Housing**

Students work in the field, take field trips and study on our campus in the Cayo area, in the western district of Belize. Weekend travel and excursions, a treat to all who study in Belize, are additional costs.

### **Summer 2010 Fees**

The program fees for Summer 2010 are **\$3,750**, include housing, transportation to and from campus and the airport on arrival and departure. It also includes breakfast on weekdays. Cell phones are provided; calls are a student expense.
